

## A Message from our club... President

Unfortunately, we had a challenging year for snow conditions. Hopefully you were able to find somewhere to ride and enjoy some time on the trails. Even though our trails did not open, I would still like to thank the dedicated volunteers who still put the signs up, brushed, mowed and who have either begun or already have taken the signs down by time you read this.

This brings me to my next point. A number of times people have asked me "since the trails did not open, do we get any funding?" "How does that affect the Club?" Those are great questions so here's the answer. Our club is still able to get funding by being reimbursed for the expenses we incur for doing the regular trail maintenance. This includes signing, brushing, mowing and removal of signs. These equipment hours and man hours are logged and submitted just as grooming is. We do not need to have opened or to have groomed to receive these funds. However, some forms of maintenance and/or equipment are billed at different rates. Grooming is the most expensive and does allow us to accrue expenses quicker.

The snowmobile program is funded by the snowmobilers themselves. Each club has a set amount of income they can possibly take in each year based on the miles of trails they maintain. In low or no snow years, some clubs do not incur as much cost to receive that income as there is less to do. That extra the club did not collect stays in the general snowmobile program and helps keep the snowmobile fund solvent for future heavy snow years when the club does max out its expenses. If a club maxes out on its income in a heavy snow year from its allotted funding, they need to rely on their own Club reserves (checkbook) to pay for the extra costs.

This is exactly why extra fundraising is so incredibly important to clubs. This is part of the reason why we host the events we do. This extra funding helps pay for the baseline set of bills of the club, just as any home or business would have so it can stay in operation. It also allows us to consider purchasing equipment that the club needs vs. using volunteers or upgrading equipment that we desperately need such as the tractors or drags. The majority of snowmobile clubs for the most part are like all other non-profits, they work on a shoestring budget and rely on the volunteers to supply the free manpower to make things go.

I'm thankful that we have built a relationship with such supportive sponsors who help the club exist. This list continues to grow and we as individuals of the club enjoy supporting them in return all year round for their services! Thank them the next time you stop in!!
