

Keep your speed and noise down when riding near buildings and homes. Leave any gates and fences just how you found them. Ride responsibly and stay in control. Minimize the impact of your snowmobile on the trail and the surrounding area—don't tear the place up!! We want to keep our landowners happy so that the properties we cross remain open to our sport, and we can keep enjoying the ride!! I know we are probably preaching to the choir here in our newsletter, but we ask that you help inform new riders or those who are not in a club how important this information is to assure our trails remain open!
